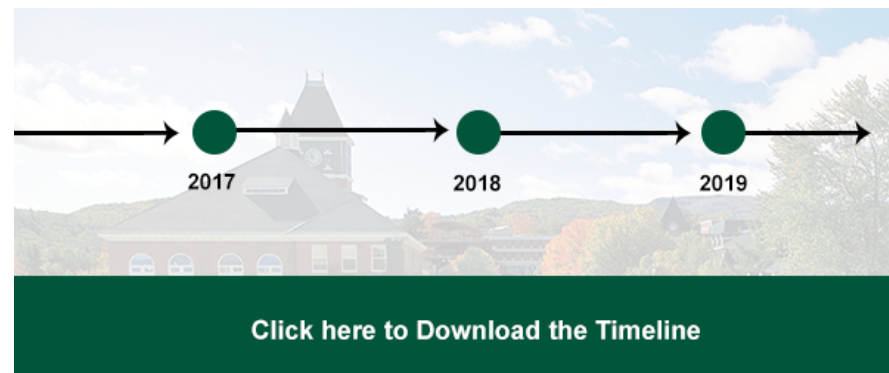

**December 14, 2015: PSU Legislators Brunch**

President Birx presented the PSU vision statement and integrated clusters and open labs initiative to the legislators. Students who participated in the 10,000 Steps project were engaged as an example of an interdisciplinary experience that might take place in an open lab. President Birx shared the initial names of the seven clusters, increased from the original six.

President Birx explains in an e-mail to all faculty on January 10, 2016, that he chose to use Tourism, Environment, and Sustainability as the working title for what was "Future Environments" because he wanted to ensure that tourism remained a part of the cluster and because it was difficult to talk to those outside the university about "future environments."

**December 14-16, 2015: Themed Discussions for Faculty and Staff**

A series of six campus conversations, one focused on each of the six integrated cluster theme ideas generated from the faculty surveys. Two sessions were held each evening for three consecutive evenings in December. Members of the Cluster Communications Committee took notes at each session and provided a synopsis about the cluster discussion to be used in developing the conceptual definition of each cluster. #### **December 7-16, 2015: OS and PAT Surveys**

These surveys assessed PAT and OS staff connection with cluster themes and collected additional ideas about cluster themes and staff integration. (Responses were received from 59 PAT and 35 OS). Results revealed some concern about how changes would take place and how staff would be integrated into the clusters. Responses were analyzed by the deans and used by the steering committee to help shape the campus conversations to be held during December and January.

#### **October 9-16, 2015: Faculty Survey**

This survey assessed faculty connection with the cluster themes that had been developing through various sessions and collected additional ideas about cluster themes and projects. This survey was piloted in late September (11 faculty responded). Responses to the survey suggested the proposed cluster themes were mostly resonating with faculty. (110 faculty responded) Responses were analyzed by the deans by mapping common elements across survey responses and shared in the November 2015 Provost's Report.
